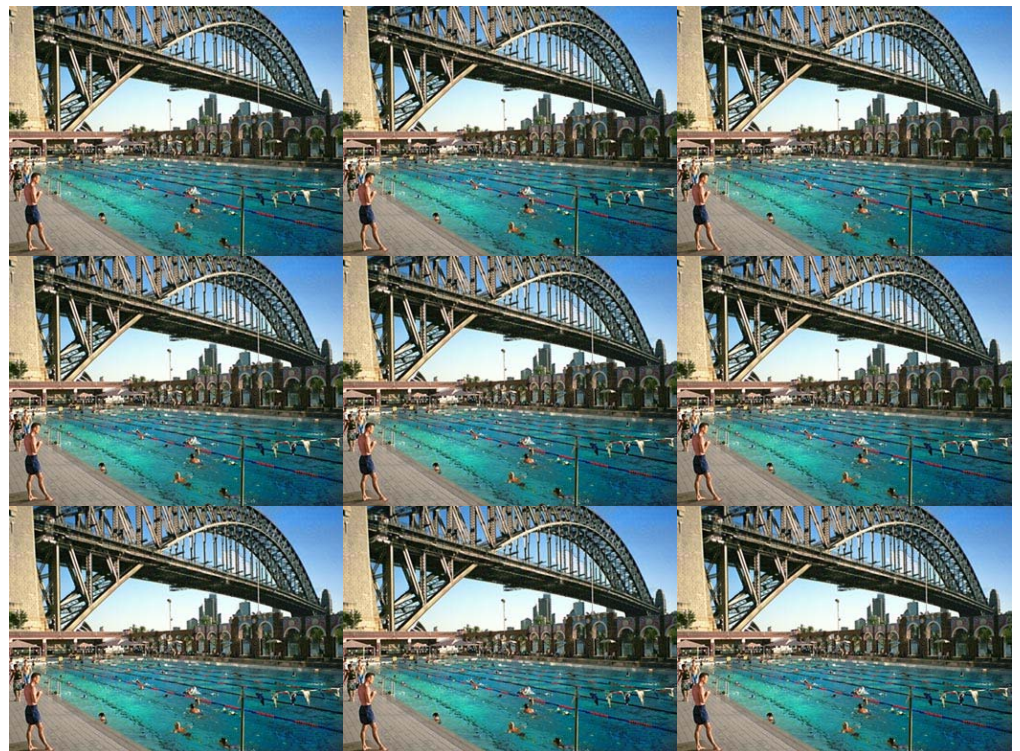

Glass Granulates, our glass recycling operation based at Moorebank, as most of you make well know, takes recycled glass that is unable to be processed and was previously destined for landfill. We processes it through a purpose built plant to produce a clean, free draining GlassSand product as well as blend it to make other sustainable engineering products for use in the civil and landscape construction markets in the Greater Sydney Region.

Last financial year Glass Granulates diverted a total of 30 432m³ into saleable product for use in the Greater Sydney Region. That's a total of more than 9 Olympic swimming pools!

SUN AWARENESS

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world. About two in three people who grow up here will develop some form of skin cancer before the age of 70, and more than 1600 Australians die from melanoma each year — the most dangerous form of skin cancer.

The major cause of skin cancer is exposure to UV radiation from the sun and other sources, such as solariums.

But the good news is that skin cancer is **almost totally preventable** and that most skin cancers can be cured if found and treated early.

We implore you take this information seriously, protect yourself in the 5 ways recommended by the Australian Cancer Council and have regular (yearly) skin checks by a skin cancer clinic.

Cancer Council recommends you protect yourself in 5 ways:

- Seek shade.
- Wear protective clothing that covers your arms and legs and body.
- Wear a broad-brimmed hat that shades your face and neck.
- Wear wrap-around sunglasses.
- Apply SPF30+ broad spectrum water-resistant sunscreen every two hours.

Through the equipment and technology we have at Chipppo, ie O-Sorters, Balers, wind separation etc, we are in a strong position as an independent operator to lock in long term supply arrangements with some of the companies.
